Possible Degrees	LLB (Bachelor of Laws). Specialisations: Criminal Law, International Law, Human Rights Law. BA in Criminology, BA in Criminology and Criminal Justice, BA in Legal Studies, BA in History and Law, BA in English and Law.
Possible Careers and Apprenticeships	<p>Solicitor: Provide legal advice, research and prepare legal documents, and represent clients in court.</p> <p>Barrister: Specialise in courtroom advocacy, representing clients in legal proceedings.</p> <p>Legal Consultant: Offer expertise in legal matters to businesses or individuals, often working independently.</p> <p>Criminal Investigator/Detective: Work with law enforcement agencies to investigate and solve crimes.</p> <p>Legal Analyst: Analyse legal issues, conduct research, and provide insights to support decision-making.</p> <p>Human Rights Advocate: Focus on protecting and promoting human rights, working with NGOs or international organisations.</p> <p>Policy Analyst: Analyse and develop policies, often in government or non-profit organisations.</p> <p>Legal Journalist: Combine legal knowledge with writing skills to report on legal issues for media outlets.</p> <p>Apprenticeships available: Paralegal; Work alongside solicitors in law firms as support staff, but in practice many paralegals do the same work as trainee or newly qualified solicitors</p> <p>Legal Executive: Type of lawyer trained to specialise as an expert in one area of law.</p>
