Level I

Units include:

- Communication and individual rights
- Individual needs with the Health and Social Care sector
- Cultural diversity
- Health and Social Care services
- Food safety and nutrition for health and social care
- Working with individuals with learning difficulties

Level 2

Units include:

- Developing effective communication
- Health, safety and security
- Equality, diversity and rights
- Developing through life stages
- Fundamentals of anatomy and physiology
- Sociological and physiological perspectives
- Complementary therapies
- Nutrition

Possible career pathway

Most Health and Social Care students will progress on to an apprenticeship or work with a company, perhaps the health authority that will offer further training. Some with Level 2 will find work in offices in a junior position until they have gained experience. Those who have completed Level 3 may well progress to Higher Education or a job with a company that offers management training programmes.
