

We are proud of the positive learning culture developed at Eggbuckland. We rarely (if ever) have any disruption in lessons and our students enjoy learning in calm, purposeful and engaging specialist classrooms. Admissions to the College in Year 7 are coordinated by Plymouth Local Authority. The admissions scheme allows parents to apply for up to three secondary schools and list them in order of priority. Each applicant receives a single offer of a secondary school place. Offers are made on the same day every year throughout the country (March 1st, or the next working day should this fall on a weekend or Bank Holiday).

The Eggbuckland Sports Academy is a programme that allows students to enhance what they learn in mainstream provision and to build their individual resilience and character within higher level sport. This exciting opportunity will give students who have a gift for football or netball a unique opportunity to develop, through a programme that will be incorporated into their curricular timetable.

Students that are part of the Academy will be offered opportunities to work with local primary schools, to run different events, to take part in trips to watch football and netball matches, to complete coaching/ umpiring qualifications. They will also take responsibility for fundraising, and gain added training and game time. Students of Eggbuckland Community College undertake a rigorous application process for the Academy which requires students to complete a letter of application, a formal interview and a physical trial.

As the Academy is for the most able football and netball players, there is limited space available. On average, a group of 28 will be selected across both sports, (specific numbers will vary slightly each year).

This is an incredibly exciting opportunity for our students and is unique among schools within the surrounding area.

Biometric Cashless Catering

The cashless payment system for College meals speeds up service. To purchase food from our catering facilities, The Boardwalk, we use a "biometric" system based on fingerprint recognition technology.

Free School Meals – Qualifying Benefits

Parents/Carers in receipt of the following support payments will be entitled to receive free school meals:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support (IS)
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance (IBJSA)
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (IRESA)
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs, that does not exceed £16,190)





- Working Tax Credit run-on (the payment someone receives for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Children who receive a qualifying benefit in their own right are also allowed to receive free school meals.

Plymouth City Council have a new process to apply for Free School Meals. Their system is very fast, efficient and Parents/Carers will know the outcome of their application almost immediately.
