Level 2 : Units include

- Introduction to the hair sector and client consultation
- Presenting a professional image in the salon
- Promote products and services
- Shampooing and conditioning
- Plaiting and twisting hair
- Create a hair image; cut women's and men's hair
- Health and safety in the salon
- Salon reception duties
- Working with others in the hair sector

Level 3 : Units include

- Giving clients a positive impression of yourself and your organisation
- Client consultation
- Shampoo, condition and treat hair and scalp
- Change hair colour and hair colour correction
- Style and finish hair
- Set and dress hair
- Cut hair using a combination of techniques
- Smoothing and strengthening systems; perming effects
- Health and safety in the salon

Possible career pathway

Most Hairdressing students will progress on to an apprenticeship or work with a salon that will offer further training. Some with Level 2 will find work in salons in a junior position until they have gained experience.
