What does the course involve?

Plastering Level 1

Units include:

- Introduction to health and safety in the construction industry
- Mixing materials and applying floating coats
- Preparing background surfaces and applying render coats
- Producing components from moulds
- Preparing background surfaces and applying finishing coats

Plastering Level 2

Units include:

- Health, safety & welfare in Construction
- Fix dry lining and plasterboards to interiors
- Apply plaster materials to interiors
- Laying sand and cement screeds
- Applying plaster materials to external backgrounds

Possible career pathway

Most construction students will progress on to an apprenticeship or work with a company that will offer further training. This is another industry where it is possible to start at the bottom and work your way to the top. A VRQ course is a good start.
